CATALOG DESCRIPTION and IAI NUMBER (if applicable):

Individual music instruction for students whose principal performing medium is the piano. Emphasis is placed on technique, literature, and performance. The course has proficiency requirements at each level. Students may register for 1 credit hour (8 hours of instruction) or 2 credit hours (16 hours of instruction). Students can repeat the course for a maximum of 4 times.

COURSE TOPICS AND CONTENT REQUIREMENTS:

1. The development of appropriate instrumental techniques, commensurate with the student's ability and experience level, through technical studies, etudes, solo and chamber works.
2. The study of all appropriate musical vocabulary.
3. The study of different musical styles within their historical contexts.
4. The development of musicianship through the application of technique, music fundamentals, style and individual interpretation, commensurate with established artistic standards and norms.
5. The preparation and live performance of at least one piece for public performance at the end-of-semester student recital.
6. The development of improvisation techniques (if applicable).

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:

1. Private instruction techniques including lecture, discussion, and various performance techniques.
2. Live demonstrations.
3. Use of recorded material, films, videotape, or online content.
4. Live musical performances.
5. Master Classes.

EVALUATION OF STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT:

Examples of evaluation methods include:

1. Attendance at lessons.
2. Performance at lessons.
3. In-class and out of class assignments.
4. Performance at recitals: Students are required to perform at least piece for a public performance at the end-of-semester student recital.

Competency 1.6 The student will demonstrate ability to play using appropriate fingering systems or sticking techniques.

Competency 1.7 The student will demonstrate ability to play accurately in tune, commensurate with normal standards, based on experience of student, as determined by the instructor.

Outcome 2: Demonstrate proficiency in scales, arpeggios, and various other technical exercises.

Competency 2.1 The student will demonstrate ability to play various major and minor scales, modes and other non-traditional or exotic scales.

Competency 2.2 The student will demonstrate ability to play arpeggios in various keys.

Competency 2.3 The student will demonstrate ability to play various other pattern exercises such as broken thirds or asymmetrical slurred or syncopated exercises.

Competency 2.4 The student will demonstrate ability to play rudiments and various other technical sticking exercises.

Outcome 3: Demonstrate proficiency in etudes and various other didactic materials.

Competency 3.1 The student will demonstrate ability to play in various tempi.

Competency 3.2 The student will demonstrate ability to play various dynamic indications.

Competency 3.3 The student will demonstrate ability to play various articulations.

Competency 3.4 The student will demonstrate ability to play various musical styles.

Outcome 4: Demonstrate an ability to play works from different periods, using techniques and stylistic conventions indicative of common period practices.

Competency 4.1 The student will demonstrate ability to play works from the Baroque era using techniques indicative of common period practices.

Competency 4.2 The student will demonstrate ability to play works from the Classical era using techniques indicative of common period practices.

Competency 4.3 The student will demonstrate ability to play works from the Romantic era using techniques indicative of common period practices.
