Aurora University will transfer up to 68 semester hours of community college credit. Only grades of “C” or higher are acceptable in transfer. The above suggestions will assist the secondary education student with course selections. We encourage students to follow the Aurora University/Illinois Valley articulation guide, and to select courses in the major or elective credit that will be supportive of the secondary education curriculum. All secondary education students must complete a minimum of 32 semester hours in a major area in which AU can grant Certification. Some majors may require more than 32 semester hours. Students should begin working toward obtaining a major in their teaching field as early as their freshman year.
