

2018 - 2019 IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Pharmacy Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Pharmacy can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Pharmacy courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Pharmacy curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Pharmacy degree. Please see a counselor when choosing your classes.

Enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours at Drake University each semester. <p>Admission to the pre-pharmacy program and participation does not guarantee admission to Drake's professional pharmacy program. Final admission decisions are determined by the quality and quantity of the full applicant pool.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rolling admission process – encouraged to submit early. • Submit application via www.pharmcas.org • Submit Drake Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) Supplemental Application + \$70. Application period opens in July for the following August. • Take the PCAT & send scores to pharmcas.org.
