IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Speech Pathology/Audiology Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Speech Pathology can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Speech Pathology courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Speech Pathology curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Speech Pathology degree. Please see a counselor when choosing your classes.

Requires a minor (recc Child & Family Studies-PSY2001, SOC1002 or Psych or Public Health-ALH1001 or Nutr. Health & Wellness) that should be started at the CC. Students planning employment in the schools should also follow the requirements for the Type 10 certificate. Students should also arrange a conference prior to transfer with the departmental admitting officer to learn about the minimum requirements for becoming a Speech Pathologist which requires a master's degree. Students who decide not to pursue a Master's degree may be eligible for employment in the human services field. *Students taking the ACT after 9-10-16 need a min. composite score of 22 and a min. writing score of 6. If you took the ACT between 9-1-15 and 9-9-16 you need a min. composite score of 22 and a min. writing score of 16. If you took the ACT before 9-1-15 you need a min. composite score of 22 and a min. combined English/Writing score of 19. Scores can be from separate ACT tests. *Students taking the SAT after 3-5-16 need a min. composite score of 1110 (evidence-based reading and writing plus mathematics) and a minimum score of 26 on writing and language test. If you took SAT before 3-5-2016 need a min. 1030 composite score (critical reading + math) and a min. 450 in writing. Scores can be from separate SAT tests.
