From Fall 2020 until now, we have had full-time faculty and **3** Part-time faculty participate, at least once, evaluating 139 ILO criteria.

For Spring 2022, we have two criteria that meet the conditions of normality.

In order to get our numbers up for all ILOs, we are now asking you to assess 50% of your students. Sample Proportion Standard Deviation: 0.02

Meets the conditions for normality. 99% Confidence interval [0.7599,0.7601]. That is, if 100 sample proportion were found, 99 would fall within the 99% confidence interval and 1 would not.

And as most of you already know, Assessment Committee implemented a process for submitting **Assessment Plans** for courses and **Assessment Reports** for individual faculty last Spring, as well.

Assessment Plans explain how your assessment relates to your course's main learning objectives.

Assessment Reports show that you are thinking about the results of your assessments and how to improve student learning.

Spring 2022 Results

- 23 Plans were filed for 21 courses by 16 faculty
- 16 Reports filed by 16 Faculty for 15 Courses, which were assessed within 22 Sections

This resulted in some new awards:

The Best Laid Plan Awards went to people who filed Assessment Plans. The Just the Facts Awards went to those who filed Assessment Reports. The We Love It When a Plan Comes Together Awards went to those who did both!



Interpreting your Minion Award

Notice that these make great pictures for your *curriculum vitae*!

If you assessed any classes between Fall 2020 and Spring 2022, you will receive a Minion Award with a rainbow, its four colors representing our four ILOs.

You will have ribbons representing the number of semesters you assessed.

You will see a jewel for each ILO criterion you assessed each semester. Red: Communication: Communicating to or with a specific audience Orange: Communication: Demonstrating purpose and organization Pink: Communication: Synthesizing and supporting ideas

Gold: Inquiry: Gathering and selecting information

Silver: Inquiry: Analyzing or investigating data

Pearl: Inquiry: Articulating reasons for decisions or solutions Purple: Social Consciousness: Describing a social system, theoretical framework, culture, or lifestyle

Yellow: Social Consciousness: Appreciating diverse perspectives or differences within social, theoretical, or cultural systems

Green: Responsibility: Articulating an assessment of self in relation to others

Blue: Responsibility: Demonstrating awareness of personal responsibility and positioning within a larger context, culture, community, or system of thought
