- Enrollments in online classes. Fall 19 to Fall 21: 86%, +767
- Students in online classes, Fall 19 to Fall 21: 68%, +387 students
- Fall 21: 246 students took more than 1 class in web, vcm, and/or blended format
- Fall 21: 1 student was resident out of state

# Online Dual Credit

- Spring 21, online dual credit offered in 15 of 20 schools in the district (pandemic)
- Spring 21, dual credit students also enrolled in blended and VCM classes
- Fall 21, 9 online dual credit classes offered; 79 enrollments, 74 students (post-pandemic)
- Exploring options to promote early bird and daytime VCM-option and flexible delivery classes to dual credit, dual enrollment students


## Grade comparisons:




