The student will apply previous learned theory and implement prior learning by utilizing the skills and techniques they have gained. The student will engage in every phase of the program –

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working 75 hours in on-the-job experience under the direction of qualified supervising teachers. Students will be placed in one diverse setting serving young children and families. Students will complete required assignments throughout their infant/toddler/two practicum/student teacher placement. Individual conferences, reports, projects, portfolio, and seminar sessions are also required, integral parts of this course.
