- 8. If you are living in a home you own or an apartment you rent, you must attach a copy of your mortgage statement or your apartment lease, with contact information for your landlord.
- 9. On a separate sheet of paper, please write an explanation as to why you believe you should be considered for financial aid as an independent student. Make sure to explain how you support yourself and why your parent(s) should be exempt from contributing to your educational expenses.
- 10. Attach any additional documentation that might support your appeal. Examples include: third party documentation from a court, social worker, school counselor, homeless shelter, clergy member, or law enforcement agency.
