WHAT IS DENTAL ASSISTING?

A dental assistant is an important member of an efficient dental team--providing a valuable service to both the office and the patient. An assistant anticipates the need of a dentist and aids in intraoral procedures, takes x-rays, prepares lab work, is responsible for disinfectinon/sterilization protocols, and can also perform office administrative duties.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

Illinois Valley Community College's Dental Assisting Program is completed in three semesters or one full year. After the completion of the required courses, you will receive a Certificate in Dental Assisting. Four additional Certificates are also available during or after completion of the program including: (1) Coronal Polishing; Enamel Sealants and Monitoring of Nitrous Oxide; (2) Coronal Scaling; and (3) Restorative Functions. With the completion of Certificates 1 and 2, you would earn a final Certificate in (4) Expanded Functions to correspond with Illinois Law.



HANDS ON TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

IVCC's Dental Assisting Program prepares you for an active role in dentistry through classroom, laboratory, and hands-on experiences in modern, high-tech facilities where highly experienced and qualified dental professionals teach and supervise all on- and off-campus activities.
