If 4 years in high school, complete IVCC Language 2001/2002 and 2003 levels. 2004 is also recommended, though it only transfers as an elective. As many Campus-Wide Gen. Ed’s as possible is also recommended prior to transfer, including a Literature & Arts course outside the major language area.
