Students should expect 4 years of study upon matriculating to UIC. Student teaching approval granted by committee only. 2.5 yrs to complete, Nat'l shortage.</p> <p>All music majors will be subject to a music theory proficiency exam upon transfer to WIU, regardless of number of credits earned in music theory. All music majors will also have to audition in a primary instrument or in voice.</p> <p>#Students must take one Global Issues course or Foreign Lang of 3yrs in HS or 3 coll. sem and one Multicultural Studies course. Courses may double dip Gen Ed/Global or Multi/Global but <u>NOT</u> Gen Ed/Multi, some majors at WIU incorporate the Global Issues course in the lower/ upper level curriculum.
