### IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Chiropractic Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Chiropractic can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Chiropractic courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Chiropractic curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Medicine degree. Students who wish to earn acceptance into the doctor of chiropractic program <i>without</i> a completed Bachelor's degree will be required to have at least 90 overall semester (135 quarter) hours of undergraduate coursework with an earned cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. A minimum of 24 credit hours in Life and Physical sciences, at least half with labs, is required (C or better).</p> <p>A well-rounded general education includes required coursework in life and physical sciences; humanities; social and behavioral sciences; and communications and languages.</p> <p>Coursework in each of these domains may include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Sciences:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. <b>Biology:</b> anatomy, physiology, general biology, cellular biology, molecular biology, microbiology, embryology, immunology, genetics</li> <li>B. <b>Chemistry:</b> general chemistry, inorganic chemistry, organic chemistry, analytical chemistry, biochemistry, toxicology, pharmacology, nutrition/nuclear medicine</li> <li>C. <b>Physical Sciences:</b> physics, biomechanics, statistics, exercise physiology, kinesiology, exercise science</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. <b>Humanities:</b> literature, history, philosophy, art, theater, music, religion, physical education</li> <li>3. <b>Social and Behavioral Sciences:</b> psychology, sociology, political science, business, economics, geography, anthropology, computer science</li> <li>4. <b>Communication and Languages:</b> oral communication, written communication, digital communication, foreign languages</li> </ol> <p>Note: Applicants who have fewer than 24 semester credits and/or a cumulative G.P.A. less than 3.0 may qualify through the alternative admissions track plan (AATP), which involves a more extensive review of personal enrollment factors.
