

2021 – 2022 IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Dentistry Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Dentistry can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Dentistry courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Dentistry curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Dentistry degree. Please see a counselor when choosing your classes.

Priority given to Illinois residents Holistic Review	<p>Transfer students are strongly recommended to complete an AS degree prior to transfer including the following: BIO 1003, 1004; CHM 1006, 1007, 2002, 2003; MTH 1005, 1008, 2001; PHY 2003, 2004.</p> <p>50 students are admitted each year. Priority is given to Illinois residents. A minimum of 90 semester hours is required for admission, but 120 semester hours (Bachelor's degree) is preferred. A holistic approach to admission is taken so GPA and DAT cut scores are no longer advertised.
