IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Pharmacy Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Pharmacy can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Pharmacy courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Pharmacy curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Pharmacy degree. Please see a counselor when choosing your classes.

Enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours at Drake University each semester. <p>Admission to the pre-pharmacy program and participation does not guarantee admission to Drake's professional pharmacy program. Application period opens in July for the following August. • Take the PCAT & send scores to pharmcas.org. In the BSPS/PharmD Pathway, students can complete the BSPS and PharmD Program in seven years, since there are 22 hours of course work that are shared between the two degrees. Students in the BSPS/PharmD Pathway receive their BSPS degree upon completion of 120 hours at the end of their first year of the PharmD Program.
