IVCC Transfer Guide for Pre-Speech Pathology/Audiology Majors

Students wishing to transfer for Pre-Speech Pathology can choose any major but need to complete the Pre-Speech Pathology courses prescribed by each university. All state universities (NIU, ISU, SIU-C, SIU-E, WIU, EIU, and U of I) offer a Pre-Speech Pathology curriculum. Colleges listed below offer the Speech Pathology degree. Please see a counselor when choosing your classes.

Requires a minor (recc Child & Family Studies-PSY2001, SOC1002 or Psych or Public Health-ALH1001 or Nutr. Health& Wellness) that should be started at the CC. A.A or A.S. degree encouraged prior to transfer. Students planning employment in the schools should also follow the requirements for the Type 10 certificate. Students should also arrange a conference prior to transfer with the departmental admitting officer to learn about the minimum requirements for becoming a Speech Pathologist which requires a master’s degree. Students who decide not to pursue a Master’s degree may be eligible for employment in the human services field.
