Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist also available. <b>Minors</b> in Event Planning, Horticulture, Hospitality, Nonprofit Admin, Outdoor Leadership, Therapeutic Rec, Youth Leadership available. #Students must take one Global Issues course or Foreign Lang of 3yrs in HS or 3 coll. sem and one Multicultural Studies course. Courses may double dip Gen Ed/Global or Multi/Global but <b>NOT</b> Gen Ed/Multi, some majors at WIU incorporate the Global Issues course in the lower/ upper level curriculum.
