Note these important formatting aspects:

- The page is labeled Bibliography.
- Each individual entry is single-spaced.
- There is a double space between entries.
- Second and third lines of entries are indented.
- If a URL must be broken at the end of a line, it is done at a punctuation mark.
- The entries are alphabetized.
- The overall formatting is the same as the rest of the essay. The margins are 1 inch and the page number continues.
